Climate Ambition to Accountability Project

- A partnership between WWF South Africa, the South African Climate Action Network (SACAN) and the Institute for Economic Justice (IEJ)
- co-funded by the European Union
- 4-year project: 2021 2025
- It aims to empower youth and civil society organisations to engage in climate policy.
- Mainstream cross-cutting issues in national climate policy – human rights, gender equality, climate equity and economic justice





Why Youth Climate Champions Programme

- Youth in SA operates at the margins of climatepolicy processes
- Youth engagement has been largely fragmented
- Lack of access to climate policy processes
- Limited access to resources, knowledge, expertise and opportunities
- It was our future at risk





Youth Climate Champions Programme

Objectives

- Empower a cohort of youth climate champions to engage strongly with climate action and in climate policy processes.
- Capacitating the next generation of climate activists and policy advocates through a range of activities which motivates future involvement.
- Provide knowledge, training, mentorship and access to policy participation that is empowering of, and co-designed with, youth themselves.

Target


- 18 35 years
- Youth interested in climate change

Outcome

- A cohort of well-capacitated youth climate activists
- Strong youth engagement with climate policy processes and implementation.

- Steering committee is made up of South African youth with experience in climate action and youth mobilizing.
- The YCC Steering Committee will provide guidance advise direction on the YCC programme
- Ensure we don't duplicate existing efforts
- Ensure relevance of our work to South African
 Youth
- Ensure we are adding value to the South African Youth Climate Action Movement





Youth Climate Champions Podcast

- Podcast on climate policy in South Africa hosted by youth.
- A total of 24 episodes in years 2 and 3
- Season 1 is out
- Season 2 greatly being planned COP27

Youth Climate Bootcamp

- To empower and train youth leaders, particularly those from low-income communities in order to ensure youth engagement in climate action and policy processes.
- 75% from low-income communities, maintain gender balance and ensure 50/50 split between youth already involved in organisations and youth that apply independently
- Social media training
- Host "Youth Parliaments" as part of the climate bootcamp.
 - Role-play exercise, understanding of national policy process.

Youth Climate Internship

- Employ Six youth champions internships within applicant organisations
- Internships to provide work experience and mentorship within the host organisations to build future climate activists and analysts

Youth Engagement with Presidential Climate Commission

- Since the launch of the YCC Programme we have been engaging with Presidential Climate Commission
 - Two learning session held in partnership with the PCC
 - Youth consultation on the JETP. The dialogue was aimed at unpacking the initial proposed interventions of the JETP, provide progress update and solicit views on JETP Investment plan, as guided by the recently adopted Just Transition Framework.
 - Supporting youth delegates to attend COP27
 - Other plans in the pipeline





Energy Transition is inevitable. Justice is not.

- The energy transition must be just and equitable; redressing past harms and creating new relationships of power for the future through reparations.
- Must enhance decent work opportunities, with a strong focus on localisation, innovation, and development in the context of South Africa's history.
- Social inclusion, and the eradication of poverty.
- It needs to prioritise skills development and education (both basic and higher) to equip school leavers for the jobs of the future.
- Energy Transition must be at the heart of meeting the Paris Agreement goals reduce carbon emissions





Just Energy Transition concerns

- Income losses
- Community Displacement
- Loss of revenue for towns/cities
- Energy Security
- Energy equity will it available, accessible, affordable for everyone?
- Climate Change





Nothing about us, without us

- Youth engagements should include all youth (rural communities, urban areas, informal settlements and communities immediately at-risk in the transition)
- Consult youth meaningfully
- Youth should play a central role in innovation and implementation, developing sustainable solutions, establishing national centres of excellence, and training centres for renewable energy jobs.
- Capacity building of youth to ensure broad buy-in to the transition
- Youth want a seat at the table and to be part of the discussions with other social partners
- Be part of implementation.
